



CTNNB1 Connect and Cure Medical and Scientific Advisory Board Letter of Intent and Grant Guidelines

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis throughout the year. Applications will be considered based on scientific rigor, alignment with the yearly research goals set by the CCC MSAB, and the CCC's yearly budget.

The goal of the CCC grant funding program is to provide seed funding to promising research projects, with the ultimate goal of (a) understanding the pathology underlying CTNNB1 syndrome, and (b) developing therapies for people with CTNNB1 syndrome.

Letter of Intent Guidelines

- You are encouraged to reach out to us with any questions before submitting an LOI
 - LOIs should not exceed 2 pages, excluding references.
 - A letter of intent should include:
 - Background and rationale
 - Any previous findings or preliminary research
 - 2-3 aims
 - Overview of methods
 - Rough timeline
 - (grants are typically funded for 6-12 month periods)
 - Rough budget
 - LOIs should be emailed to: research@currectnnb1.org.
 - Your LOI will be reviewed by the scientific director and the MSAB within 2-4 weeks. If the LOI proposes robust research that is in alignment with CCC's research priorities, you will be invited to submit a full grant proposal.
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Grant Guidelines

- Grants should not exceed 6 pages, excluding references
- There are no strict format requirements, but a grant should include:
 - Specific Aims
 - Background and rationale
 - Any previous findings or preliminary research
 - Research Strategy, including potential pitfalls and alternate approaches
 - Significance of the research to the CTNNB1 community
 - Budget and timeline
- Grants should be emailed to: research@currectnnb1.org.
- Your grant will be reviewed by the scientific director and the MSAB within 3-5 weeks. The CCC team may reach out to you for further clarification. CCC may conditionally accept a grant, provided the authors make changes to their research strategy, budget, or timeline to better match the goals of CCC.
